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Principal's Report

2016 School Concert at Hamer Hall Tuesday 2 August

As there is only three weeks until our concert, all classes are in the midst of rehearsals and costume fittings. When the weather permits you can hear the voices of young children singing in our school grounds amidst the temporary fencing that is strategically placed near our building.

The Office ladies are managing the ticket sales for our 2016 School Concert to be held at Hamer Hall on the Tuesday, 2 August.

The tickets are allocated corresponding to the time of purchase via the Qkr Report and will be sent home via the purple folder system. The students are occupying Rows A through to L. No refunds are available.

On the day of the concert all staff and students will travel by bus to and from the city for a whole school rehearsal. Further details about the rehearsal arrangements and an early dismissal opportunity will be sent home early next week.

Removal of Oil Tanks

You may have noticed the many barriers erected around our school recently. Beaumaris North Primary School was identified as one of the many schools with underground tanks. These tanks were originally installed to store fuel oils for heating. The Department of Education/ Compliance Program/ Infrastructure & Sustainability Division manages the identification, design solution, removal and disposal of the tanks in accordance with EPA 888 and the 'Management Guidelines for Underground Petroleum Storage Systems and Associated Contamination at Victorian Schools'.

We appreciate your understanding and patience in this matter which is obviously beyond our control, and we will continue to keep you informed of the progress. We are trying to restrict the disruption and noise level to before and after school hours. We have been advised that this project will take 3 - 4 weeks.

Qkr


The following instructions explain how to complete your Master Pass registration then use your Master Pass login details to access the Qkr app for your school. This can be useful if having trouble registering on the Qkr app, or if you have registered on the Qkr app but are having trouble adding cards, especially foreign issued credit cards. Any actions you do on the Master Pass website will be reflected within your Qkr app.

On the next screen check the boxes for reading and consenting to the Master Pass Terms and Conditions, and the Master Pass Privacy Notice, then select

Complete the following information as requested and select **Next >** after each screen is completed:

your name, email, mobile phone details and a password;

a security question;

your card details;

your billing address details, then select **Add >**


This completes the setup of your Master Pass account.

Access the Qkr app and on the following screen enter your Master Pass email address and password, then select **Sign In** (not **Register**).

Follow the instructions on the 'how to' guide to find your school and add your children's details.
