<b>Digital Technologies Contribution</b> - The last two years showed us that technology is vital to providing an ongoing connection between our teachers and students. The Digital Technologies Contribution means that the school can have on-site technology and digital education staff, who maintain our fleet of devices and equipment, and enable our teachers to use these important tools to give our students the education they seek now, and the digital capabilities they'll need in the future.	\$165.00
<b>First Aid, Health &amp; Wellbeing Contribution</b> – The emotional and social wellbeing of students is critical to their experience at BNPS. Our significant investment with both a Wellbeing Officer and First Aid Officer ensures our students receive the care they need. All staff receive annual first aid accredited training for the safety of all students and we maintain sufficient first aid supplies in all classrooms and our first aid room, including the provision of additional Asthma and Anaphylaxis equipment. We must also maintain a high COVID safe environment including sanitiser, masks, gloves and signage. Funding for this from DET is very limited.	\$120.00
<b>School Contribution</b> – This contributes to non-consumable costs, not funded through the Department of Education and Training and will support the provision of programs that enhance the standard curriculum. This includes ongoing reading material, musical instruments, sporting equipment and continual rebuilding of resources for all curriculum areas.	\$110.00

<b>Facilities Maintenance Contribution</b> – It is vital for the safety and maintenance of our school grounds, and to meet compliance requirements for OH&S, that we employ a Facility Manager at the School’s expense. This cost covers four days per week, resulting in an immediate response to repairs and issues, from light fittings to toilets, and maintenance of our grounds, including lawn mowing and removal of damaged tree foliage. As a result, our grounds, buildings and equipment are safe and of a presentable standard with no parent working bees.	\$150.00
<b>Tax deductible contributions</b>	
<b>Building Trust</b> - tax-deductible contribution – is vital for periodic enhancement and upgrade of our buildings, facilities and playground equipment which falls outside funding provided by the Department. This includes the cyclic replacement of heating, cooling, carpets, window furnishings, outdoor fixed furniture and recreational facilities.	\$105.00

### Financial Support for Families

Beaumaris North Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF). If you hold a valid means-tested concession card you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursion or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.
- State Schools’ Relief. Assistance with school uniforms if your child is starting Prep and is eligible for CSEF. State Schools’ Relief will provide basic uniform items or a voucher if you’re eligible.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
