International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme

Beumaris North Primary School is an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School authorised to teach the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP). It is an internationally recognised programme and provides the framework for implementing the Victorian Curriculum.

Our school is a dynamic and progressive school with an active commitment to the maintenance of an open, co-operative, considerate and friendly environment in which all children are encouraged to reach their full potential. The safety and wellbeing of all students is paramount.

The IB Primary Years Programme is an international programme of teaching and learning that focuses on the development of the whole child with the overarching concept of how to develop international mindedness. The PYP strives towards developing internationally minded students who demonstrate the attributes of the IB Learner Profile. Accordingly, at BNPS we aim to educate inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring students, who are encouraged to ask challenging questions, critically reflect, and take responsible action.

Our Vision

We will CARE for others, showing EMPATHY, compassion and RESPECT towards the needs and feelings of others. We will show RESPONSIBILITY to our own learning and belongings, showing self-discipline and commitment. We will show TRUST acting with integrity, honesty, and a strong sense of fairness.



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Administration

Arrival Procedure

It is important that your child is at school by 8.55am in preparation for line up to ensure they hear all the important instructions at the beginning of the day. On arrival to school, students are required to place their school bag in their designated area and may then play until the music sounds. Once the music sounds, students must stop what they are doing and line up in their designated area. In the event of inclement weather, students may be admitted into the classrooms at 8.50am. Students must not be left alone in the school grounds before 8:45am – see 'Yard Duty Supervision'.

Dismissal Procedure

School finishes at 3.30pm (Monday to Friday) – earlier on the last day of the term (2.30pm) and the last day of the year (1.30pm). Once the bell sounds, children make their way out of their classroom, collect their bags and go to their designated dismissal area. All students are expected to leave the school premises immediately after dismissal. Students must not be left alone in the school grounds after 3.45pm - see 'Yard Duty Supervision'.

Emergency Contact Details

Please advise the school immediately of any changes to your details (address, telephone number and emergency contact/s), to enable prompt contact at all times.

Late Arrival

Students are expected to be punctual, as late arrivals cause disruption to the smooth running of the class. Students who arrive at school after 9.00am must be 'signed in' by a parent/carer via the Kiosk at the Office and taken to class.

Leaving School During School Hours

If your child needs to leave the school during school hours (e.g. medical appointment), it is necessary for a parent/carer to 'sign your child in and out' via the Kiosk at the Office and then collect them from the classroom - no child will be permitted to leave the school during school hours without being signed out and collected by a parent/carer.

Notification Of Absences

For the safety and wellbeing of children, it is a Department of Education and Training (DET) requirement that parents/ carers notify the school of their child's full day absence on the day of absence (early in the morning or ahead of time where possible). It is not necessary to phone the school or notify your teacher as the roll will be automatically updated. Please note that parents cannot edit or delete approval notes once they have been entered into Compass – please contact the school Office if an approval note has been entered in error.

If you do not enter an approval advising us that your child will be absent, you will receive an 'Attendance Notification: Student Unaccounted For' email asking you to enter a note on Compass.

Office

The Office handles all administrative matters, payments and enquiries – please pop in and see the lovely Office ladies should you require any assistance. Please note that the Office is unattended from 8.40am to 8.50am daily, due to compulsory staff briefing, and closes at 4.00pm each school day - earlier on the last day of term.

Online Consent/Payment For Excursions & Incursions

Notification of excursions and incursions requiring online consent/payment are posted via Compass. **Please ensure that online consent forms are completed by the due date.** If you elected not to pay 'Key Experiences' in full, a payment section will appear for you to enter your credit card details **before** you can provide consent. Please note that if consent/payment is not completed by the 'due by date', you will no longer be able to provide online consent/payment.

Qkr Payments

Qkr (pronounced - Quicker) is a free app to enable you to use your smartphone to make various school payments including Canteen and Uniform Shop orders. Class Representative Program

Class Representatives provide administrative support for the teachers and the school as required and communicate to the class parent group. Class Representatives organise social events such as coffee catch ups, dinners and end-of-term/year get togethers for the class. A call for expressions of interest in a Class Representative role is sent out to current BNPS parents at the end of each year (in preparation for the year ahead) and again at the beginning of the year if the position is not filled. Compass Parent Portal

Compass is our school management system for parents, staff and students. The parent portal enables you to:

- Access a daily News Feed and school documents
- Provide online consent/payment for excursions and incursions
- Report absences and monitor attendance
- View your child's Learning Task feedback & Semester Reports
- Book Parent/Teacher Interviews
- View the School Calendar

We strongly recommend that you login to Compass on a daily basis, as this is our primary means of communication (information from teachers or the school is not sent home in hard copy). News items are posted to the News Feed daily. We encourage you to make use of the Compass page on our website which includes FAQs and video tutorials on various modules and to email beaumaris.north.ps@education.vic.gov.au at any time should you require assistance.

Contacting Teachers

Notes may be passed to teachers (via the Multipurpose bag for Prep – Year 2) or an email can be sent to: beaumaris.north.ps@education.vic.gov.au. This email account is checked regularly throughout the day and emails are forwarded on as appropriate. Please note that teachers are unable to respond to emails that do not come via the school email address. Informal discussions may be arranged upon request at any time throughout the year to discuss specific issues, however please be assured that you will be contacted should we have any concerns.

Uniform & Personal Belongings

Hats

All children are required to wear a broad brimmed bottle green hat for protection from the sun from **1 September until the end of April** - No Hat, No Play! Children who forget their hats will be reminded to play in the shade.

Labelling

We urge you to **clearly label ALL garments**, in particular jackets and tops, so that items can be returned through our Lost Property system. School hats, bags, lunch boxes, drink bottles and shoes should also be labelled. See: <http://beaumarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/parent-information/uniform/> for our labelling guidelines.

Lost Property

Lost Property is stored in red bins located in the Breezeway outside the Prep Learning Centre. It is the student's responsibility to promptly collect any lost property. In order to keep our Lost Property under control, parent volunteers sort items into 'labelled' and 'unlabelled' piles on a regular basis. Clearly labelled items are returned to their owners and unlabelled items are donated to the Uniform Shop. At the end of each Term, ALL unclaimed items (named or unnamed) are donated to the Uniform Shop. Parents are notified ahead of time (via Compass) when a clean out is due to occur. We kindly ask parents to please return all items to the bins when checking for lost property (so they are not left on the ground to get wet and dirty).

Money

Children should only bring money to school for over-the-counter Canteen purchases – and only a small amount. If you are sending money for your Prep/Year 1 child to purchase items from the Canteen (at lunch or recess), it is recommended that they bring a small **named** purse to keep in the front of their school bag.

Personal Property

We strongly discourage bringing valuable items to school. The Department of Education and Training (DET) does not hold insurance, nor does it accept responsibility for personal property brought to schools by students, staff and visitors. DET has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.

Uniform

All students are expected to wear the full BNPS school uniform including the correct coloured socks, BNPS jumpers, jackets, hats and appropriate footwear. School uniform should be neat and clean. See: <http://beaumarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/parent-information/uniform/>

Uniform Shop

Uniforms can be ordered via [Qkr](#) and, providing stock is available, orders will be filled within a week and delivered to your child's classroom. We also have a large offering of great value second-hand items available for purchase at the Uniform Shop (located in the Prep breezeway) which is open from 8.45am – 9.30am every Monday, Wednesday & Thursday morning (unless notified otherwise via Compass). Bike Shed

A bike shed is available (entry via McDonald Street) to secure the bicycles of children who ride to and from school. The bike shed is unlocked in the morning, locked during the day and then re-opened when school is out – the Bike Shed is not locked overnight or on weekends. Bikes and scooters must be put **inside** the Bike Shed (**not** against the outside fence). We strongly encourage students to bring their own bike lock to use inside the Bike Shed.

Canteen

Open Monday, Wednesday and Friday (not the days beginning with 'T') unless notified otherwise via Compass – all orders must be placed by 8.30am via [Qkr](#) - see <http://beaumarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/parent-information/payments/qkr/>. Sushi is available on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Please ensure you provide your child with play lunch and fruit break if they have a lunch order (students can also purchase items with cash at recess and lunch). Our Canteen Manager operates the Canteen along with our parent volunteers. A link to a digital roster is posted on Compass - please sign up for as much or as little time as you can spare! Toilets

No adults are to access student toilets for their own use at any time. If non-school children require the urgent use of an amenity, student toilets may be used under strict parental supervision. If a parent requires the urgent use of an amenity, the disabled toilet in the main building may be used ('Staff' toilets are for staff only).

Celebrating at School

We understand that celebrating your child's birthday is a joy and one which we are happy to celebrate with you, however, please note that at Beaumaris North Primary School, a risk minimisation policy has been implemented – our policy is 'No Sharing of Food'. Therefore, please do not send any treats or snacks to the school to be given to other students.

Child Safety

BNPS is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children. Our documentation relating to the important Child Safe Standards (*Child Safe Policy, Child Safety Code of Conduct and Statement of Commitment to Child Safety*) can be found on the BNPS Policies page of our website at <http://beaumarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/about-us/policies/> - we strongly encourage you to familiarise yourself with these. **It is important to note that it is now a criminal offence for school staff not to report any reasonable suspicion that a child has been abused or is at risk of being abused** (including abuse that has or is suspected to have taken place within or outside of school grounds and hours).

Cyber Safety

A copy of the 'eSmart Internet Acceptable Use Agreement' will be given to your child and explained by the teacher – please discuss, sign and return (students are not allowed to access the internet until this form has been received). See: <http://beaumarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/esmart/>.

Dog Therapy

Our Therapy Dog, Wally, comes to school with Miss Tilley. We understand that there may be some families who do not want Wally to work directly with their child. An online 'opt out' form is made available during the enrolment process.

Emergency Management

BNPS has a comprehensive Emergency Action Plan in case of an emergency. There are two main evacuation areas: the Oval and Basketball courts. When the emergency signal is activated, all members of the school community are required to stop and listen to the instructions that follow the signal. They will then be instructed to move to the designated evacuation area and report to a staff member in a fluorescent vest.

eSmart

Essential Agreement

Food at School

We encourage all children to bring healthy food for all meals. Children require food for:

Recess	11.00am - 11.30am	A small healthy snack
Fruit break	12.30pm	A piece of fresh fruit or vegetable
Lunch	1.30pm - 2.30pm	A healthy lunch

Please indicate to your child what they should eat at recess, fruit break and lunch, and ensure all food containers are labelled. Due to the high risk of cross contamination, **it would be appreciated if you could refrain from sending any food to school containing nuts** e.g. peanut butter sandwiches, Nutella, loose nuts and snack bars containing nuts.

Parent Involvement

Water Bottles

Please encourage your child to bring a named water bottle to school to use in the classroom.

Working with Children Check

Anyone wishing to volunteer at BNPS is required to present a current Working with Children Check (WWCC) at the Office. This applies to **all parent volunteer positions** e.g. Literacy groups, Canteen, Mother's/Father's Day Stalls, Uniform Shop, Bike Education, Excursions, Sports Days, Student Disco, Class Reps, Fete, Market Night, Year 6 Graduation and School Concert etc. Apply online at <https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au> – checks are free and valid for 5 years!

Yard Duty Supervision

Staff exercise a great amount of care when supervising students within the school grounds. Teaching staff supervise the grounds during lunch and recess breaks and are on duty from 8.45am - 9.00am before school, and from 3.30pm - 3.45pm after school. Students must not be left alone in the school grounds before 8.45am or after 3.45pm as the school does not provide formal supervision for children who are on the premises before or after these times. Parents are responsible for their children when they are in the school ground beyond the duty hours of teachers.

Important School Rules

BNPS Policies

School Council develops, reviews and updates school policies according to a formal review schedule - these policies must be adhered to. See: <http://beamarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/about-us/policies/>.

Climbing Trees Not Permitted

For the safety of children and to protect our natural environment, the climbing of trees is against our school rules and is not permitted at any time – children must play away from the fences and not in garden beds. Teachers enforce this rule during the hours of duty; however parents are responsible for their children beyond this time – please supervise your children carefully to prevent injury.

Dogs In The School Grounds

Dogs are not permitted on the school oval at all between the hours of 7.15am and 6.00pm (when our students are in attendance and when our **Outside School Hours Care** program is operating) – even if they are on a leash. Dogs are allowed to run on the oval (on or off leash) before 7.15am and after 6.00pm only. Dogs are permitted in other areas of the school grounds during the above-mentioned times but must be kept on a hand-held leash.

Only adults are permitted to be in charge of dogs on school premises and they must be responsible for their dog at all times, which means making sure the dog is kept a safe distance away from students (including line-up areas) and other dogs in the school ground. Dogs are not permitted to be tied up and left unattended. Owners are kindly asked to ensure that their dog does not disrupt Assembly. It is the responsibility of the dog owner to clean up after their dog (and remove from school property).

Riding In The School Grounds

Riding of scooters, bikes, skateboards etc., is not permitted in the school grounds at drop-off or pick-up (school and non-school children), see: <http://beamarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/riding-in-to-and-from-school/>.

Staff Carparks

For safety reasons, parents and students are not permitted to walk through staff car parks or use them for parking – please use pedestrian paths.

Two Minute 'Kiss N Go' Zone

There are two 'Kiss N Go' zones on Wood Street where you can quickly drop and collect your child – **this is not a parking area** – you are only allowed to stop for up to two minutes, no double-parking or going into school. If you need to walk your child into the school grounds, you must park in one of the surrounding streets, in a legal parking area, see: <http://beamarisnorthps.vic.edu.au/parking/>.

Use Of Mobile Phones & Electronic Devices

Whilst on school property and during school excursions and camps, use of mobile phones or personal electronic devices is not permitted by students unless specifically authorised by the Principal.

Extra-Curricular Activities

House System

BNPS provides a House System for student activities. Family members are placed in the same House and new students with no siblings are placed in a way which ensures even numbers across the four Houses. Inter-School Sport

Library

Students are able to borrow books from the Library according to their class/year level timetable. The Library is also open one lunchtime per week (2.00pm - 2.30pm) for quiet reading, borrowing and drawing. Students from Prep – Year 2 receive a weekly specialist Library lesson (30 minutes) taken by a trained Teacher Librarian. Specialist Programs
